### What's 'indigenous'?

Local indigenous plants are those that are not only native to Australia, but also to the Dandenong Ranges and upper catchments of Port Phillip and Western Port bays. These plants are grown from plant material collected within this region.

### Why we grow indigenous plants?

- Local plants provide essential food and shelter for local birds, insects, butterflies and animals broadly
- Indigenous plants reflect the 'original natural character of our area, preserving and enhancing a sense of local identity
- Indigenous plants have naturally adapted to suit local soils & climates, thus will grow without fertilisers & sprays
- Local indigenous plants provide an essential part of the diverse landscape \* cultural character of the Dandenongs
- Indigenous plants pose no weed threat to the local environment, being 'in balance' with the local ecology
- Growing and planting indigenous plants of our region helps protect their future survival & maintain genetic diversity

### Varying seasonal conditions and increasing plant rarity may limit the availability of some species.

Australina pusilla ssp. muelleri	SHADE NETTLE	Non-stinging, 30cm H, creeping herb, shaded position
Bossiaea prostrata	CREEPING BOSSIAEA	Delicate, creeping. Tiny yellow- brown flowers
Centella cordifolia *	SWAMP PENNYWORT	Fast growing, Lt. green kidney shaped leaves, damp sites
Desmodium gunnii	SOUTHERN TICK-TREFOIL	Low, scrambling peren. herb that may root at leaf nodes
Dichondra repens	KIDNEY WEED	Prostrate, mat forming ground cover, kidney shaped leaf
Galium australe	BEDSTRAW	Spreading, wiry plant, grow amongst other plants
Gonocarpus humilis	CREEPING RASPWORT	Semi- prostrate herb with toothed leaves
Goodenia geniculata	BENT GOODENIA	Mat forming, green-red foliage, yellow flowers
Goodenia humilis *	SWAMP GOODENIA	Erect herb often rooting from axil. Profuse yellow flowers
Goodenia lanata	TRAILING GOODENIA	Trailing herb, rooting at nodes, green leaf, yellow flower
Hakelia latifolium	FOREST HOUND'S TONGUE	Oval spiky leaves, tiny bluish-white flowers, shade position
Hydrocotyle hirta	HAIRY PENNYWORT	Small, carpeting, hairy leaved plant
Kennedia prostrata	SCARLET RUNNER	Prostrate, 1-2m W, Striking scarlet pea flowers in spring
Lobelia anceps *	ANGLED LOBELIA	Suckering, small spreading herb, blue fan-shaped flowers
Mentha australis	AUSTRALIAN MINT	Slender erect herb, green leaf small white flower. Fragrant
Mentha laxiflora	FOREST MINT	Spreading herb, erect stems and fragrant mauve flower
Platylobium infecundum	FAMINE FLAT-PEA	Trailing low plant, orange/yellow pea flower, .5m x 1m W
Solanum prinophyllum	FOREST NIGHTSHADE	Sprawling small star hairs/prickles. Blue flower. Shade
Veronica calycina	HAIRY SPEEDWELL	Slender trailing herb, pale blue flower. Well drained soils
Viola hederacea	NATIVE VIOLET	Matting ground cover, small edible purple & white flower

<i>Carea gaudichaudiana</i>	FEN SEDGE	Coarsely tufted plant which grows at edge of gravel/mud
<i>Carex appressa</i> *	TALL SEDGE	Hardy sedge to 1.5m, damp soils to stream edge position
<i>Carex breviculmis</i>	SHORT-STEM SEDGE	Small densely tufted sedge, adaptable to range conditions
<i>Carex brownii</i>	STREAM SEDGE	Tufted sedge, underground stems at water's edge
<i>Carex fascicularis</i> *	TASSEL SEDGE	Hardy sedge, drooping seed head, wet position
<i>Carex inversa</i>	KNOB SEDGE	Loosely tufted, spreading clump. Pale green leaf full sun
<i>Cyperus lucidus</i> *	LEAFY FLAT SEDGE	1.5m H, rust red seed head, damp to wet position
<i>Dichelacne micrantha</i>	PLUME GRASS	Small clumping grass, unusual hairy seed heads
<i>Dryopoa dives</i>	GIANT MOUNTAIN GRASS	Tall loosely tufted grass in shade. Flower stems cane like
<i>Echinopogon ovatus</i>	HEDGEHOG GRASS	Scrambling grass, round, hairy seed heads, shady site
<i>Eragrostis brownii</i>	COMMON LOVE-GRASS	Coarse, tufted grass to 30 cm, sunny position
<i>Gahnia sieberiana</i>	RED-FRUITED SAW-SEDE	Large, clump to 2m H, black seedhead, red fruit
<i>Isolepis inundata</i> *	SWAMP CLUB-RUSH	Small, clumping tufts, damp to wet position
<i>Juncus amabilis</i> *	HOLLOW RUSH	Hardy tufted clump to .5m H, damp position
<i>Juncus gregiflorus</i>	GREEN RUSH	Tufted rush with bright green shining stems
<i>Juncus pallidus</i> *	PALE RUSH	Hardy tufted rush to 1m H, damp to shaded position
<i>Juncus pauciflorus</i>	LOOSE-FLOWER RUSH	Tufted perennial spreading rush from underground stems
<i>Juncus planifolius</i> *	BROAD-LEAF RUSH	Small clump, to 30cm H, damp position
<i>Lomandra longifolia</i> var <i>exilis</i>	SPINY-HEADED MAT-RUSH	Strap like narrower leaves, hardy, clump .5-1m H
<i>Lomandra longifolia</i> var <i>longifolia</i>	SPINY-HEADED MAT-RUSH	Large vigorous tussock plant, hardy plant strap, like leaf
<i>Lomandra multiflora</i>	MANY-FLOWERED MAT-RUSH	Small strap like leaves, many flowers on branched stems
<i>Microlaena stipoides</i>	WEEPING GRASS	Native lawn grass, narrow weeping seed head
<i>Poa ensiformis</i>	PURPLE SHEATH TUSS. GRASS	Large tussock forming grass for moist, sites
<i>Poa labillardieri</i>	LARGE TUSSOCK GRASS	Large tussock 1m H, silvery foliage
<i>Poa morrisii</i>	VELVET TUSSOCK GRASS	Small tussock 30cm H, stem to .9m H, soft foliage
<i>Poa sieberiana</i>	GREY TUSSOCK GRASS	Dense green to greyish green fine tuft variable positions
<i>Poa tenera</i>	SLENDER TUSSOCK-GRASS	Slender trailing perennial, branches rooting at nodes
<i>Rytidosperma caespitosum</i>	COMMON WALLABY GRASS	Tufted tussock, fluffy seed heads, stems to 1.2m H
<i>Rytidosperma pencillatum</i>	SLENDER WALLABY GRASS	Tufted tussock, fluffy seed heads, stems to .6m H
<i>Rytidosperma racemosum</i>	CLUSTERED WALLABY GRASS	Tufted tussock, fluffy seed heads, stems to .6m H
<i>Rytidosperma pallidum</i>	RED ANTHOR WALLABY GRASS	Robust spreading perennial tussock, green/bluish leaf
<i>Rytidosperma setaceum</i>	BRISTLY WALLABY-GRASS	Erect, slender, dense tuft tolerates a range of conditions
<i>Themeda triandra</i>	KANGAROO GRASS	Green to purple-copper colour leaf- .5m H, stems to .9m H

<i>Alliaria cardiocarpa</i> *	SWAMP DAISY	Fast growing tufted perennial tuft herb, white flower
<i>Arthropodium milleflorum</i>	PALE VANILLA LILY	Small clump, 30 cm high branch of pale pink flowers
<i>Arthropodium strictum</i>	CHOCOLATE LILY	Slightly taller, .5m H with violet flowers, choc. scent
<i>Brunonia australis</i>	BLUE PINCUSHION	30cm high in flower, sunny position
<i>Bulbine bulbosa</i>	BULBINE LILY	Fleshy clumps, tall spikes with yellow flowers
<i>Burchardia umbellata</i>	MILKMAIDS	White star-shaped flowers, sunny position
<i>Chamaeschilla corymbosa</i>	BLUE STARS	Small tufted perennial herb with slender tubers 2-3m long
<i>Chrysocephalum apiculatum</i>	YELLOW BUTTONS	Silvery herb to 30cm, clusters of yellow flowers
<i>Chrysocephalum semipapposum</i>	CLUSTERED EVERLASTING	Erect silver-grey foliage, dense clusters of yellow flowers
<i>Coronidium scorpioides</i>	BUTTON EVERLASTING	Yellow dandelion-like flowers to 30cm
<i>Craspedia variabilis</i>	COMMON BILLY BUTTONS	Round yellow flower to .4m H, sunny position
<i>Dianella longifolia</i> var. <i>longifolia</i>	SMOOTH FLAX-LILY	Strap like leaves, panicles of bluish flowers
<i>Dianella revoluta</i>	BLACK-ANTHER FLAX-LILY	Tufted, underground stems, bluish flowers, purple berries
<i>Dianella tasmanica</i>	TASMAN FAX-LILY	Taller, flower spike to 2m H, hardy

<i>Diplarrena moraea</i>	BUTTERFLY FLAG	Tufted clump, large white iris flower
<i>Helichrysum luecopsidium</i>	SATIN EVERLASTING	White paper daisy, yellow centres. 50 cm high
<i>Hypoxis hygrometrica</i>	GOLDEN WEATHER-GRASS	Small tufted perennial herb, striking yellow flower
<i>Lagenifera stipitata</i>	BLUE BOTTLE DAISY	Tiny purple daisy flowers to 15cm high
<i>Leptorhynchus tenuifolius</i>	WIRY BUTTONS	Small wiry clump to 30cm H, yellow flowers on stems
<i>Microseris walteri</i>	YAM DAISY	Tufted peren. herb, Shiny leaf, yellow flower edible tuber
<i>Patersonia fragilis</i>	SHORT PURPLE-FLAG	Tussock forming perennial, narrow leaves, purple flower
<i>Patersonia occidentalis</i>	LONG-LEAF PURPLE FLAG	Clump forming 40cm H, tall stems purple iris flowers
<i>Pelargonium australe</i>	AUSTRAL STORK'S BILL	Hairy herb with aromatic lobed leaves, pink flowers
<i>Pelargonium inodorum</i>	KOPATA	Erect short-lived herb with long & short hairs, pink flower
<i>Stackhousia monogyna</i>	CREAMY STACKHOUSIA	Upright herb, clustered cream flowers in a spike
<i>Stylidium armeria</i>	COMMON TRIGGER-PLANT	Tufted herb, erect green leaf and a stout stem pink flower
<i>Stylidium graminifolium</i>	GRASS TRIGGER PLANT	Attractive pink flower tufted spikes to 1 metre
<i>Wahlenbergia gracilis</i>	SPRAWLING BLUEBELL	Spreading low wildflower, fine foliage, soft blue flowers
<i>Wahlenbergia stricta</i>	TALL BLUEBELL	Suckering 30cm x 50 cm H. Blue flowers
<i>Xerochrysum palustre</i> *	SWAMP EVERLASTING	Erect herb, long leaf, large yellow daisy flower. Wet areas

<i>Correa glabra</i>	ROCK CORREA	Dense shrub, yellow-green bell flowers
<i>Correa reflexa</i>	NATIVE FUCHSIA	Pale green/yellow leaf & tube flowers, small leaf. 1m H x W
<i>Correa reflexa var lobata</i>	COMMON CORREA	Medium shrub 1.5m HW. Large green tube nectar flower
<i>Dillwynia cinerascens</i>	GREY PARROT PEA	Fine leaves, showy clusters of red- orange pea flowers
<i>Dillwynia glaberrima</i>	GREY PARROT-PEA	Greyish-green shrub, downy stems, clusters of pea flowers
<i>Dillwynia sericea</i>	APRICOT PARROT PEA	Narrow hairy leaves, yellow-apricot pea flowers
<i>Epacris gunnii</i>	ACE OF SPADES	Erect shrub, small bell flowers, moist to wet soil
<i>Epacris impressa</i>	COMMON HEATH	Prickly leaf, masses of white, pink or red flowers in winter
<i>Gompholobium huegelii</i>	COMMON WEDGE PEA	Large bright yellow pea flowers, sunny position
<i>Gonocarpus tetragynus</i>	COMMON RASPBURT	Low, bushy herb. Tiny pinkish flower. Moist to dry soils
<i>Goodenia elongata</i>	LANKY GOODENIA	Creeping, perennial herb. Large, solitary yellow flowers. Damp soil, tolerates waterlogging
<i>Goodenia ovata</i>	HOP GOODENIA	Hardy, fast growing, yellow flowers all year
<i>Hibbertia riparia</i>	ERECT GUINEA-FLOWER	Showy, erect shrub to 1m H, yellow flowers
<i>Lomatia ilicifolia</i>	HOLLY LEAF LOMATIA	Crinkly broad leaves. o 150 mm high in shaded foothills
<i>Lomatia myricoides</i>	LONG-LEAF LOMATIA	Open rounded shrub to small tree. Perfumed cream flower
<i>Pimelia flava ssp. flava</i>	YELLOW RICE-FLOWER	Slender shrub to 1.5m H. Clusters of yellow flowers
<i>Pimelia glauca</i>	SMOOTH RICE-FLOWER	Upright to 60cm H, grey-green leaves, cream flowers
<i>Pimelia humilis</i>	SMALL RICE-FLOWER	Suckering, upright to 50cm H, dense cream-white flowers

<i>Platylobium reflexum</i>	VICTORIAN FLAT-PEA	Erect shrub when growing on other shrubs. Hairy stem
<i>Prostanthera mellisifolia</i>	BALM MINT-BUSH	Dense rounded shrub, aromatic leaf with mauve flowers
<i>Pultenaea gunnii</i>	GOLDEN BUSH-PEA	Spreading shrub to 1m H, yellow & red pea flowers
<i>Pultenaea hispidula</i>	RUSTY BUSH-PEA	Fine grey leaves, yellow pea flowers
<i>Pultenaea scabra</i>	ROUGH BUSH-PEA	Small heart shaped leaves, orange-yellow pea flowers
<i>Pultenaea weindorferi</i>	SWAMP BUSH-PEA	Slender upright hairless shrub, bright yellow pea flowers

<i>Coprosma hirtella</i>	ROUGH COPROSMA	Thick pointed leaf, small shrub, red flower & red berry
<i>Coprosma quadrifida</i>	PRICKLY CURRANT BUSH	Open, upright, spiny shrub. Small, edible red berries
<i>Grevillea alpina</i>	MOUNTAIN GREVILLEA	Upright, hairy leaves, clusters of red and yellow flowers
<i>Hakea nodosa</i>	YELLOW HAKEA	Yellow flowers, soft needle-like foliage, to 2m H

<i>Lomatia myricoides</i>	LONG-LEAF LOMATIA	To 2.5m H. Grows Upper Western Port creek banks
<i>Olearia asterotricha</i> ssp. <i>lobata</i>	ROUGH DAISY-BUSH	Erect shrub, rough hairy leaves, blue/mauve flowers
<i>Olearia erubescens</i>	MOTH DAISY-BUSH	Small shrub, dark green oblong leaf, white daisy flower
<i>Olearia glandulosa</i>	SWAMP DAISY-BUSH	Open erect shrub. Dense white daisy flowers, damp soil
<i>Olearia lirata</i>	SNOWY DAISY-BUSH	Soft open shrub, massed white daisy flowers

<i>Acacia stictophylla</i>	CINNAMON WATTLE	Pendulous habit, scented foliage, good screening plant
<i>Acacia mucronata</i>	NARROW-LEAF WATTLE	Variable habit, creamy yellow spike flowers, hardy
<i>Acacia oxycedrus</i>	SPIKE WATTLE	Dense prickly leaf shrub, yellow flower balls late Winter
<i>Acacia paradoxa</i>	HEDGE WATTLE	Spiny shrub, 3m H x 3m W. Excellent hedge and bird hide
<i>Acacia stricta</i>	HOP WATTLE	Upright shrub to 4/5m H, grey-green foliage
<i>Acacia verticillata</i>	PRICKLY MOSES	Open shrub, 5m H x 5m W, with fine prickly foliage
<i>Banksia cunninghamii</i> var. <i>spinulosa</i>	HAIRPIN BANKSIA	Large nectar producing yellow orange flower fruit/cones
<i>Banksia marginata</i>	SILVER BANKSIA	Yellow bottle brush flowers, grows to 5 metres
<i>Callistemon pallidus</i>	LEMON BOTTLEBRUSH	Dense upright shrub, stiff silvery/red leaf, yellow flower
<i>Bursaria spinosa</i>	SWEET BURSARIA	Shiny dark leaves, masses of cream flowers, spiny, to 5m
<i>Cassinia aculeata</i>	DOGWOOD	Aromatic foliage, large white flower clusters
<i>Cassinia longifolia</i>	SHINY CASSINIA	Medium shrub, narrow leaf, small white flower. Dry areas
<i>Cassinia trinerva</i>	THREE-VEINED CASSINIA	Dense shrub/ small tree with narrow leaf, pale flower

<i>Cynogeton procerum</i>	WATER RIBBON	Aquatic herb, ribbon leaves, submerged up to 1m

<i>Lindsaea linearis</i>	SCREW FERN	Small fern frond, creeping rhizome, slender fronds, shade
<i>Polystichum proliferum</i>	MOTHERSHIELD FERN	Tufted fern with long arching fronds often in colonies
